COURSE CONTENT:

Those who apply will join the Guild of Armourers at Apprentice status (Level 4, yellow badge). The aim of this award is to achieve Journeyman status (Level 3, green badge)

To do this candidates have to do an exam: this is taken in two parts - a written multiple-choice paper and a practical examination. Candidate will attend a series of practical courses, for each of which s/he will be given a certificate of attendance. A set of certificates covering all the courses will count as a pass for the practical element of this examination, thus requiring the candidate just to sit the written examination in order to achieve Journeyman Armourer status.

The minimum age for an apprentice armourer is 12. The minimum age for a Journeyman armourer is 18. A person under the age of 18 may take the examination and if successful will be promoted on their eighteenth birthday.

Examination Procedure

The examination is taken at a Regional event or above or at a specific course and is taken in two parts - a written multiple choice paper and a practical examination. The written paper is taken and marked first. If the candidate passes this element then the examiner should move on to the practical examination. Syllabus (level 3)

Theory - Written Paper

- As level 4 plus extra emphasis on disciplinary matters (offences and penalties etc.), phrasing and judging of hits
- Dealing with technical problems

Practical

- Phrasing
- Hand Signals
- Observation of bouts at D.E. Regional level (to include one bout in last eight), pools/D.E. at Opens or at a specific course.

This 3-hour workshop is an excellent opportunity to learn and understand more about the sensitive and important subject of protecting children from abuse and how to handle situations in the workplace. This workshop will help you, the Teacher/Coach/Tutor/Official/volunteer:

- Identify good coaching practice to promote a positive relationship with children
- Identify sport situations and coaching practice that might constitute either poor practice or possible abuse
- Identify ways of dealing with your own feelings about child abuse
- Recognise the signs and symptoms of abuse and appreciate why reporting it is so difficult
- Identify appropriate action if abuse is suspected
- Identify appropriate action if a child discloses he/she has been abused
- Describe appropriate practice that reduces the likelihood of abuse occurring
